ABOUT CMA

For 98 years, CMA has brought world-renowned artists to Des Moines and central lowa, offering unforgettable and life-changing artistic and educational experiences. From its inception, CMA has presented legendary classical artists such as Sergei Rachmaninoff, Marian Anderson, and the Sphinx Virtuosi, to name a few. In 1982, CMA added jazz to its seasons. Included among a veritable who's-who of jazz luminaries are Wynton Marsalis, Esperanza Spalding, and Dianne Reeves. This year, CMA inaugurated its first intentionally programmed Multi-Cultural/World/Americana performances with concerts by Chinese guzheng virtuoso Wu Fei and GRAMMY-winner Abigail Washburn and the all-female Aizuri Quartet with Syrian-American clarinetist, Kinan Azmeh. This new programmatic series intends to broaden diversity and inclusivity in both artist/concert presentation and audience development, thereby representing the growing diversity of Des Moines and central lowa.

CMA Educational programming presents our world-renowned artists delivering free educational events to schools, retirement facilities, community centers, and libraries. The many educational offerings include performances, clinics, hands-on activities, master classes, and panel discussions. CMA Studio programming is specifically designed for children and young people in Des Moines area schools and colleges. The goal is to support, supplement, and enhance school-and college- based arts instruction in concert with the lowa arts core curriculum. Community based programming often focuses on performances and in-depth conversations relating to music, the arts, access, inclusivity, diversity, and equity. Both endeavors seek to enlighten and create a space for dialogue and learning through equitable and inclusive access to music. Priority is given to historically underserved schools and communities.

CMA also presents the Belin Quartet. The Belin Quartet is an endowed professional string quartet whose community centered mission offers (10) free concerts during the summer and (10) free educational performances throughout the fall and spring at schools, retirement communities, libraries, community centers, and other venues. The free Salisbury House summer concert series presents the quartet in a beautiful and inspired outdoor setting and offers access to free valet parking and tram service for our older and mobility challenged patrons.

CMA's Scholarships and Awards offer financial assistance to Iowa middle, high school, and college students based on need and talent. This year CMA developed a new *Excellence in Teaching Award* designed to offer professional development funding for an Iowa K-12 music educator.

In addition to the aforementioned developments in artist inclusivity and audience access, CMA has placed a special focus on partnership development. This year we have deepened and/or developed relationships with the following organizations in an effort to increase and broaden access to, and inclusivity in our programming: Des Moines Public Schools, Des Moines Public Libraries,, the Boys and Girls Club of Central Iowa, Drake University, Des Moines Area Regional Transit Authority (DART), Des Moines Music Coalition, Iowa Asian Alliance, Latino Heritage Festival, Ballet Des Moines, International Rescue Committee, Refugee Alliance of Central Iowa, Lutheran Services of Iowa, Dentons Davis Brown Law Firm, Above and Beyond Cancer, John Stoddard Cancer Center, Iowa Music Educators Association, Des Moines Music Teachers Association, Southwest Iowa Community College, Iowa Public Radio, Iowa Public Television, Des Moines Symphony, Des Moines Symphony Academy, Des Moines Performing Arts, Hoyt Sherman Place, Noce, xBk, Community Jazz Center, Salisbury House, Plymouth Church, World Food and Music Festival, and the Fischoff Competition.

Recently, CMA began a new and important transportation partnership with DART. This access initiative provides free bus service to our concerts and programming to those individuals who may have difficulty finding transportation. Similarly, in partnership with Drake University and the Boys and Girls Club of Central Iowa, CMA launched an initiative promoting access to food and essential supplies. Audience members are encouraged to bring non-perishable food items, health and hygiene products, and school supplies to all CMA and Drake University Music Department concerts held in Sheslow Auditorium. All donations go to the Gregory & Suzie Glazer Burt Club Food Pantry. Collection bins decorated by B&GC students are available in the lobby at every concert.

Whether bringing world-renowned artists to thousands of public-school students and the community, supporting our senior population, offering free and open access concerts to the greater Des Moines community, partnering with our non-profit colleagues, collaborating with DART to make programming more accessible, or collecting non-perishables to fight food insecurity, CMA believes that music transforms lives.

In collaboration with local school districts and universities, Hoyt Sherman, and the community, these free events will allow access to students and community members from across the metro and central lowa. CMA anticipates reaching approximately 300 students in schools that typically do not host artists. CMA will offer complimentary tickets to students and families. For those needing transportation assistance, DART will grant free access to buses via a designated QR code.			
11/10/23	Chuck Owen and ReSurgence	Multi-GRAMMY-nominated and Gugenheim winning composer Chuck Owen and ReSurgence will present two concerts and several education events in the DMPS district and at Drake University. CMA anticipates several hundred students and community members will benefit from these free events. For those needing transportation assistance, DART will grant free access to buses via a designated QR code.			

11/15/23	Roomful of Teeth	GRAMMY-winning vocal ensemble Roomful of Teeth will present a concert of new music and engage in a collaborative discussion with students, artists, thinkers, community leaders, and community members. With a special focus on creativity, composition, and collaboration, the panel will emphasize the creative process as well as present stories and projects that ruminate on a sense of place, home, and community. This will be a collaborative endeavor bringing together numerous arts organizations from throughout the metro. The event will be both live and streamed for maximum access and participation. CMA will offer complimentary tickets to participants involved in the education event. For those needing transportation assistance, DART will grant free access to buses via a designated QR code.
12/1/23	Dallas Brass	The Dallas Brass will present a rehearsal, multiple interactive clinics, and a concert at Valley High School. The concert will feature Valley High School choir and band students performing with the Dallas Brass. CMA will offer complimentary tickets to the approximately 275 students involved in the performance and education events.
